COVID-19


Update - 06 June 2020

May 2020 / Q & A.....

Over the past few weeks the committee has received some questions from our members. The slides below are the questions raised and answers.

Reminder: if members have a question please use the suggestion box on our web page as you will receive a written reply once discussed by the committee.





Q 1.....

- a) A member recently asked if we can use the zoom platform for our meetings.
- b) This was discussed by the committee and due to the large number of members that will potentially log in, we will not be using this as a platform for our meetings.

As Covid-19 progresses into stage 2, the committee may review other mediums.





Q 2.....

- a) A member recently asked if stock images can be used to enhance their images, during these difficult times.
- b) In short "no" we don't allow stock images to be used. As your image needs to be your own work.

There are several ways in which a layer can be created, as you can photograph a paint texture, a bird or even a butterfly and add them as a layer in Ps.

The committee has always stated this is an honour system.





Q 4.....

- a) A member recently asked if the judges can provide feedback on all images submitted.
- q) Unfortunately no we cant, feedback has always been for novice entires that will receive feedback, whilst we also give feedback on Gold, Silver and Bronze this is an added bonus and is mainly directed at bronze and silver to help boost their ratings if entered in a competition.





Q 3.....

- q) A member recently asked if an iPhone panorama is classified as a modified image.
- a) In short "yes" the committee has decided this is a modified image. The reason for this is that several images are stitched together to form one image.





Monthly Images:

Judging

- 1. Judging is basically an assessment of the quality of the image and in most cases this is based on a theme and set criteria (or description).
- 2. In short, your Open Category image needs to have "message and meaning", as "once an image is submitted for judging, the photographer looses their right of interpretation" it is then up to the judge to interpret message and meaning. It does also mean that your image is a bad image, just that the judge on the day could not understand the story line.
- 3. This is why WAPJA ask the clubs use a theme/subject and a descriptor, as it then guides the judge.





Judging

- 4. Most importantly be creative, and use light correctly to enhance your image.
- 5. Create emotion
- 6. Try and visualise your image before taking the photo itself, then work on creating that image and developing the Art of Photography..
- 7. Use composition to enhance your image, we all understand the "rule of thirds", but there are lots of other components that are used in composition;



Judging

Composition.....

- The rule of thirds
- Achieve balance
- Use leading lines
- Be aware of patterns and symmetry
- Frame your subject
- Utilize cropping
- Create a focus point
- Allow your image to breath
- Rule of odd's
- Use shapes





Judging

Note - when photographing Street art, it is important to make it your own image, not someone else's image (as this may also be in breach of copyright). Develop a story line within the image.

Add layers, this can be as simple as a person walking in front or the wall art, or a busker or a person begging for money.

The WAPJA score sheet has also been added to the presentation to allow members to understand the scoring system used in Western Australia





WAPJA EXHIBITION SCORING SYSTEM

- Version 9, August 2017

LEVEL	DESCRIPTION			
Level 8 Gold+ distinction	All judging criteria are strong. Combined elements have produced a supreme example of art photography. The image displays the highest level of excellence in art photography.			
Level 7 Gold	Most judging criteria are expertly handled. A very strong image displaying a high level of excellence in art photography. Technical standard is very high.			
Level 6 Silver	Many elements are very good and the technical standard is high. A strong image with good evidence for classification as art photography. Clear evidence of intent to combine skill and artistry. Successful visual communication has been achieved.			
Level 5 Bronze	Sound image with at least one strong element. Approaches art photography - message present but not strong. Any flaws are minor or compensated by other successful elements. Some intent to combine skill and artistry. Possibly no flaws but no significant strengths. Content and medium may be acceptable but message is not clear or strong. Centre of interest usually obvious. Usually technically good - often call a record shot.			
Level 4				
Level 3	Some attempt has been made to control content and medium. Needs more effort to convey message and meaning. Centre of interest may not be clear. Flaws and/or distractions may be evident.			
Level 2	Quality of content and medium is not adequate. Improvement required in the craft of photography. Little attempt at deliberate composition or light handling. Flaws and distractions may be present. Snapshot quality			
Level 1	Little evidence of good camera skills An unacceptable image for a photographic exhibition No indication of the centre of interest. Flaws and distractions usually present.			

Note: the presence of flaws or distractions will devalue any image, even those with a strong message

Whist we will continue with judges written feed back on the novice images, we cant expect our judges to comment on all of the images.








